During all the steps and games listed below consent will have to be given by the dog at each approximation. if dogs does not give consent the training process must back up one to two approximations.

All games are played with

very **slow tiny movements** to begin with. Add playful noises and toys to the process if they elicit play and joy in the dog. Use a trail mix of very tricks: nose, paw, fetch.

Nosewich Game

Before you introduce muzzle play the nosewich game. end result: use your hands to create a muzzle, top hand on top of muzzle, bottom hand cupping chin. This is lured and shaped starting with chin then moving to adding the top hand. the steps of training and the finished product are always paired with food treats.




When to use a muzzle:
